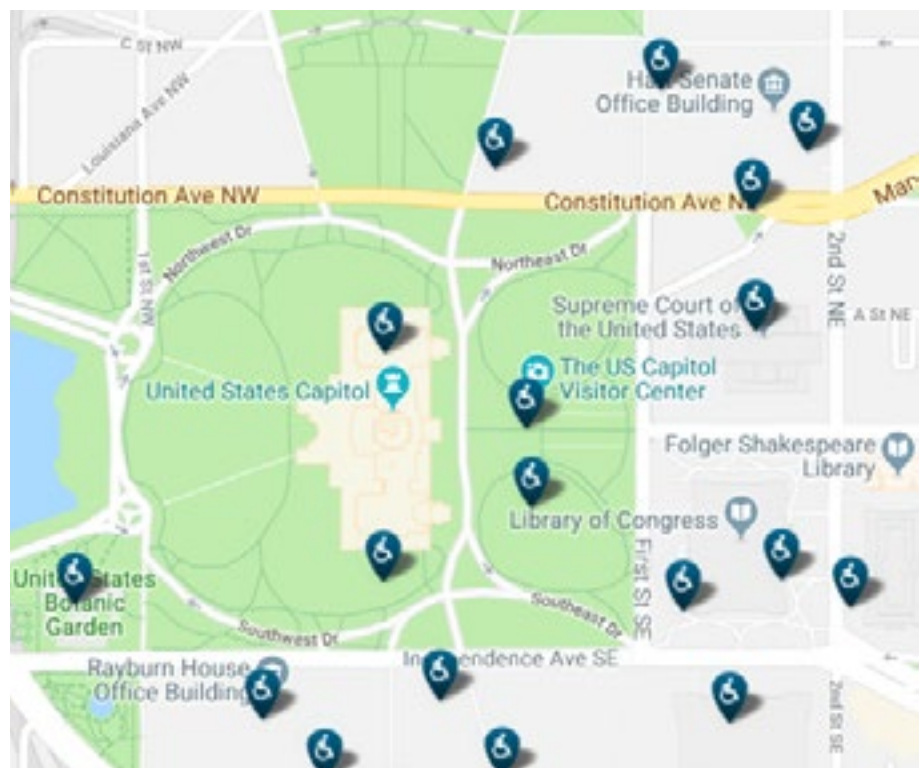

VISITORS WITH DISABILITIES

- Wheelchairs may be requested from Capitol Visitor Center staff wearing red vests or at one of the Information Desks in Emancipation Hall.
- Listening devices with audio description of the orientation film and exhibition are available at the Information Desks in Emancipation Hall. An audio-descriptive tour of Exhibition Hall provides visitors who are blind or have low vision with a self-guided experience of the Capitol Visitor Center's exhibits. The nearly three-hour descriptive narration is available on a handheld device which visitors may request at the North Information Desk in Emancipation Hall. Visitors may also download the audio-descriptive tour onto a personal device. Download the audio-descriptive tour in MP3, ZIP or Text file formats.
- An ASL tour of the Capitol is available.
- Sign language interpretation for tours is available when booked in advance. Email Interpreters@saa.senate.gov. All films have open captioning.
- Family Restrooms are available throughout the Capitol Visitor Center.
- Service animals are allowed in the Visitor Center and the Capitol.
- A public TTY is located near one of the gift shops on the Upper Level.
- Copies of all Capitol Visitor Center brochures in alternative formats (large print, braille, HTML) are available at the Information Desks.
- Emergency evacuation information for visitors with disabilities is available.
- Additional information on accessibility in the Capitol and the House and Senate Office Buildings is available at the Architect of the Capitol's website.
- Both the Senate and House have accessible Galleries which include televisions with closed-captioning. The Senate has informational materials available in alternative formats.
