



FY 2024 Application Review Status, as of 9/12/23

- 7003 Applications
 - 91.3% complete
 - \$512 million 7003(b) funds ready to pay
 - \$16.6 million 7003(d) funds ready to pay
- 7002 Applications
 - 55% complete
 - \$32.5 million in foundation payments ready to pay


7003 Monitored Applications (196 total)






PRELIMINARY FY 2024 Data Trends for 7003 Payments

- Student count information is from School Year 2022-23.
 - First year since the pandemic that school districts were unable to use Fall 2019 child counts.
 - 70% of applicants experienced a decrease in Federally connected WSUs.
- Expenditure information used for LCR and TCE is from School Year 2020-21.
 - Increases for almost all applicants, by approximately 7% on average, due to pandemic spending.
- Student counts are having a larger effect on the Maximum Payment calculations.
 - Maximum Payments have decreased for 63% of applicants when compared to FY 2023, by approximately 6% on average.
- Impact Aid is distributed **proportionally** to LEAs. We are keeping a close eye on the proration we will be able to pay for interim and final payments.



Enter the email address you use to access IAGS.

Create a password.

Set up at least one additional authentication factor.



Enter your SSN.

Provide a photo of your state ID.

Verify your phone number OR address (address verification takes 3-7 business days).



Contact Impact Aid if you get a "401 Unauthorized" error.




ED's Digital Equity Initiative
