DC Environment


- Divided government has meant that few bills have passed or will pass
- FY 2024 Appropriations still incomplete (more than 6 months late)
 - Operating under 2-tiered CR: expires March 22nd for L-HHS-ED
 - House and Senate have finally agreed to toplines increase for defense, level-funding for domestic
 - CAVEAT: with some domestic programs receiving increases, others will have to be cut
 - 12 appropriations subcommittees have received allocations
 - Programmatic funding levels largely agreed to
 - Key sticking points remain:
 - Controversial riders: abortion, trans rights, etc.
 - House Freedom Caucus opposes additional spending
 - Johnson will need to rely on Democratic votes to pass approps bills threat to his remaining as Speaker

FY24 Appropriations

- FY24 House Subcommittee Approved Bill Makes Draconian Cuts to Education
 - USDE Overall: \$28 Billion Cut
 - Title I: Cut by 80% (-\$14.7 Billion)
 - Title II: Eliminated
 - Title III: Eliminated
 - IDEA: Level Funded
 - Impact Aid: Level Funded
- FY24 Senate Committee Approved Bill Level Funds Most Programs
 - Title I: +\$175 Million
 - Title II: Level Funded
 - Title III: +\$7 Million
 - IDEA: +\$175 Million
 - Impact Aid: +\$10 Million

FY24 Appropriations – Impact Aid

- Impact Aid did exceptionally well in FY23
 - \$59 million increase in Basic Support
 - \$1 million increase in Federal Property
 - \$1 million increase in Construction (the first in many years)
- For FY24, we originally sought a \$70 million increase overall
 - \$65 million increase in Basic Support
 - \$2 million increase in Federal Property
 - \$1.5 million increase in Construction
 - \$1.5 million increase in Children with Disabilities
- In this environment, level-funding in FY24 would be a win



FY24 Appropriations – Impact Aid

- NAFIS's Revised Request: Senate Bill
 - \$690,000 increase in Federal Property
 - \$8.76 Million increase in Basic Support
 - Level Funding in Children with Disabilities
 - \$590,000 increase in Construction

Advancing Toward Full Funding

- Advancing Toward Impact Aid Full Funding Act
 - Introduced in both chambers with updated figures
 - HR 1591: Levin (D-CA) and Cole (R-OK)
 - S 871: Lujan (D-NM), Tillis (R-NC), Gillibrand (D-NY), Mullin (R-OK), Durbin (D-IL) and Cornyn (R-TX)
 - Both bills include a five-year glidepath to
 - Fully fund Basic Support (\$2.45 billion by 2029)
 - Provide a proportional increase to Federal Property (\$150 million by 2029)
 - Increase Children With Disability funding (\$120 million by 2029)
 - Return Construction to \$45 million/year program by 2029.

Infrastructure

- Impact Aid Infrastructure Partnership Act
 - Revised bill introduced in Senate by Senator Hirono (D-HI) -- S. 2808 -- and Rep. Garamendi (D-CA) -- H.R. 6698
 - \$1 billion added to Construction over 4 years
 - 25% provided by formula to eligible districts
 - Receive funds under 7003 and: 20% or more residing on Indian lands or military-connected, or heavily impacted
 - 75% provided via competitive grants
 - Priority for districts with acute emergencies in their facilities (e.g., building code violations), teacher housing in need of repair or replacement, or limited or no bonding capacity
 - Matching requirements
 - 10%-25% based on LOT for 7003
 - 25% for 7002

- Co-sponsor the Impact Aid Infrastructure Partnership Act (S. 2808/H.R. 6698)

HOW TO DELIVER A POWERFUL MESSAGE IN A HILL MEETING

Your goal is to become a trusted resource for your Member of Congress and his or her staff, and to develop a strong supporter of Impact Aid.

PREPARING FOR THE MEETING

Use the NAFIS website, nafisdc.org, to increase your familiarity with Impact Aid.

Do your homework by identifying your Member of Congress':

- Committee Membership
- Impact Aid Coalition Membership
- Recent local newspaper articles
- Recent press releases
- Policy interests
- Space on the political spectrum

Prepare an example of how Impact Aid is important for your school district.

Develop your message using the <u>NAFIS Talking</u> Points and <u>Elevator Pitch Worksheet</u>.

Identify a group leader and plan what each participant will contribute and when.

Plan to use video, if virtual, even if the person you're meeting with is only on audio.

DURING THE MEETING

Be bipartisan and stay positive.

Share your stories and connect them to the interests of your Member of Congress. Be yourself and bring your passion.

Be helpful and offer to get back to the Member of Congress if you don't have the answer to a question. Make your ask, using the <u>NAFIS Talking Points</u> to tell your legislator what you want them to do.

Tailor to the Member of Congress' role
 Tailor to your expertise

Take time to listen and give your Member of Congress and their staff the opportunity to respond.

- Ask, "How can we help you?"
- Ask, "What is your boss' position?"

AFTER THE MEETING

Follow up on any promises made - unanswered questions, statistics, resources, etc.

Foster the relationship with regular contact

- Set calendar reminders to contact your policymakers at least once every guarter
- Share school district news and other successes with your Members of Congress
- Make sure you're following your Members of Congress on social media

Use Twitter to thank your Congressperson use the <u>NAFIS Sample Tweets</u> for ideas - or share a brief article on your district website. Be sure to send it to them!

Send a "Thank You" email

- Let the person you met with know you appreciate their time and support
- Reiterate any talking points if necessary
 If the Member of Congress is not on the

- Invite them to visit your school district


Remember, advocacy is a long-term process the meeting is only the first step!
