



  - 0 submitted late


### Number of 7003 Applications Submitted By Date





### FY 2025 Monitoring


- 202 LEAs selected for monitoring
  - 17 LEAs used Electronic Data Collection for the first time
  - 64 LEAs did not have an eligible FY 2024 application (including new applicants)
- Two webinars held last week for selected LEAs



### Local Contribution Rate (LCR) Analysis


- LCR is multiplied by weighted Federal child count to determine LEA's maximum payment
- LCR data on per-pupil expenditures lags by three years (e.g. FY 2024 LCR is from School Year 2020-2021)
- Weighted Average LCR calculated by taking the average LCR by state and multiplying it by the total Weighted Student Units in that state
- 2022 pandemic spending <u>likely to</u>
   <u>cause another LCR increase of similar</u>
   <u>magnitude to 2021</u> for FY 2025
   payments (stay tuned)




### FY 2024 Data Trend Summary

- Student counts held steady for the FY 2022 and FY 2023 application years due to the pandemic option to use survey data from FY 2021.
- Student count decreases will likely drive the final payment rate for FY 2024. 70% of applicants experienced a decrease in weighted student units versus FY 2023.
- LCR increases due to inclusion of pandemic spending will help many, but we will likely see an increase in LEAs receiving a 7003(e) hold harmless payment in FY 2024.
  - For FY 2023, **9%** of grantees received **\$33 million** total in 7003(e) payments.
  - For FY 2024, assuming the same appropriation as FY 2023, an estimated **35% of grantees** would qualify for approximately **\$76 million total** under 7003(e).
